We are now in our second full week of distance learning at the elementary. Each teacher has a detailed schedule of their day that was provided to students and families. Our paraprofessional staff is meeting in small groups with students and are providing reading and math interventions virtually or in-person. Homework and materials distribution takes place on Friday afternoons from 12:00-4:00 p.m. at the elementary school. Social distancing, masks, intensive cleaning and diligence in remaining at home if ill, all helped to keep us here until December 1.
