6. Eight individuals from the elementary attended Day Two of the **Regional PreK-3 Leadership Workshop** that was held at the Steele County History Center on Tuesday, March 5. The emphasis for this day was on teaching and our instructional quality within our PreK-3 system. Aligning our curriculum, assessments, and instruction while ensuring high-quality learning environments for all students was our focus for this day.

7. On Wednesday, March 13, Amy Johns, Bre Bethke, Dena Summer, Jennie Bunn, Heidi Thomas, and Brooke Krohn, along with the secondary school team will receive the No Bully Solution Coach Training. No Bully developed Solution Team as an intervention that any teacher or staff member can implement to respond to bullying at their school. Teachers who have been through the one-day training are certified as a Solution Coach®. When a student is the target of bullying, the Solution Coach convenes a Solution Team comprised of the bully, bully-followers and positive peer leaders; assures them they are not in trouble; walks them into the shoes of the target so that they feel what the target is feeling; and asks the students what they can do or stop doing to end the bullying. Research demonstrates that educators trained as Solution Coaches are solving 90% of incidents of bullying. We are excited to be able to support our students and staff with this opportunity.
