- **5.** Board & Administrator for Board Members Monthly Publication September 2017 Reflection I have provided a brief reflection on a few of the articles from the September publication. I hope you have had an opportunity to read and reflect.
 - Should the superintendent participate in policy review? The article encourages school boards to include the superintendent in policy review and development. The superintendent is in a position to provide professional advice, conduct clerical tasks for the board, and know if any new policy is workable and/or legal.
 - Best process for handling citizen or staff complaints? Try this The article offers suggestions on how individual board members should respond to citizen concerns including:
 - ✓ The board agrees on a standard process for handling citizen and/or staff complaints.
 - ✓ Be open to listen respectfully and take complaint seriously.
 - ✓ Honor the district's chain of command by referring stakeholders, including staff members, to the proper person on the chain of command whether that is a teacher, coach, principal, or superintendent.
 - <u>Plan board meetings well to focus on what's important</u> The article features an attorney and board consultant who offers insights on what makes a successful board meeting including:
 - ✓ Superintendent and board chair work closely in advance to determine agenda items.
 - ✓ The meeting is the board's meeting; not the superintendent's who is a resource.
 - ✓ Focus the board's work on issues that are truly important.
 - ✓ Provide enough time to work on the important issues.
 - ✓ Make sure the board has enough information to make decisions.
 - ✓ Board members should come to each meeting prepared.
 - ✓ Results come from meetings being planned and deliberative.
 - Policy vs. administration: Keep the distinction clear The article reminds the board that board policy dictates what the district will do. Implementation of the board policy belongs to the superintendent and staff. The article offers three questions to better understand the distinction between the superintendent's role and the board's.
 - 1. Does the board delegate day-to-day management of schools to the superintendent?
 - 2. Is our board professional about respecting the chain of command and referring questions, concerns, and complaints from staff and the public to the superintendent or appropriate party?
 - 3. Does the board set board policies that affect personnel, while the superintendent hires, promotes, disciplines, evaluates, and terminates employees?
- **6.** Facility Assessment Boar d Work Session Follow-up We are in the process of scheduling a Board work session on November 8 or 9 with representatives from ISG to continue discussion on facility planning in response to the facility assessment recently completed by ISG.
