- **4. Board & Administrator for Board Members Monthly Publication May 2018 Reflection -** I have provided a brief reflection on a few of the articles from the May publication. I hope you have had an opportunity to read and reflect.
 - Board member demands district job for child The article reminds board members the
 importance of not prioritizing personal interests and gains over the interest of the school
 district.
 - 7 ideas for giving the board a policy focus The article provides 7 policy-focused ideas and strategies to be part of the new board member orientation including:
 - 1. Provide information to potential new board members that highlight roles and responsibilities.
 - 2. Encourage potential board members to attend meetings.
 - 3. Set up a group meeting with board members and focus on demonstrating the board's authority comes from its collective action in a legally constituted board meeting.
 - 4. Provide one-on-one orientation to new members and reinforce the board's policymaking role.
 - 5. Use workshops and training sessions to help board members learn roles and responsibilities.
 - 6. Have new member share personal assessment of roles.
 - 7. Provide board meeting minutes from the base year.
 - <u>Create a top-notch governing board</u> The article offers three strategies for board members to build a strong board-administrator relationship and a board that remains focused on governance including:
 - > Develop trust and keep lines of communication open.
 - ➤ Eliminate any committees related to programs as programming is the responsibility of the superintendent.
 - > Offer superintendent assistance.
 - <u>Teamwork tip: Spend time together</u> The article encourages boards and superintendents to spend time together including attendance at school board association events.
- 5. Facility Planning Update Meeting #3 of the Task Force was held on Wednesday, May 30. Information was shared about Science rooms as well as our fitness and wellness programming and impact of facilities. Tours of both buildings were provided. Meeting #4 is planned for Monday, June 25 at 6:30 pm at the Secondary School that will focus on prioritizing categories that have been examined in the previous three meetings including:
 - Facility Assessment Report Priorities
 - School Security
 - Elementary Art & Music
 - Expanding preschool for all to include wrap-around daycare
 - Secondary Special Education
 - Secondary Career Technology Education Program
 - STEM and STEAM Programming K-12 including Maker Space Area
 - Secondary Arts (Visual, Music, Theater)
 - Collaborative/Personalized Learning
 - Collaborative Work Spaces
 - Science Programming and Spaces
 - Fitness/Wellness Programming and Spaces
 - Lower Level Egress for Locker Rooms and Wrestling Room at Secondary School

A fifth meeting will be held on July 23 to assist with the development of the community survey. A sixth and final meeting will be held in later September or early October to examine the survey results and to develop a recommendation for the Board.
