- **3.** *Board & Administrator for Board Members* **Monthly Publication November 2016 Reflection** I have provided a brief reflection on a few of the articles from the November publication. I hope you have had an opportunity to read and reflect.
 - <u>Rumors have no place in the superintendent's evaluation</u> The article offers advice from school board consultant Bob Hughes regarding superintendent behavior "rumors," and advises that it is important for board members to share any rumored behavior or performance issues directly with the superintendent.
 - <u>Sharpen up your board meetings</u> The article shares tips for board to consider when attempting to manage discussion and move school business along efficiently including:
 - ✓ Keep the discussion going . . . don't let one board member dominate the discussion
 - ✓ Be aware of the non-verbal indicators of boredom . . . this can be a sign that it is time to move on
 - ✓ If consensus comes early, it's time for the vote . . . no reason to keep talking if it appears a decision has been made
 - ✓ Post-meeting debriefings can prevent future problems . . . a private conversation by the board chair with a board member about "dominating" the conversation and meeting may help prevent the behavior continuing in the future
 - ✓ Consider a timed agenda . . . may be beneficial if board members see a planned amount of time for each item.
 - <u>Wander around in the weeds and expect some pushback from the superintendent</u> The article reminds board members of their role which does not include doing the "staff's job." Board members are reminded that "the full board is the only entity that can issue directives to the superintendent, not an individual trustee."
 - <u>Retreat activity: Board team writes a member job description</u> The article offers a template for a school board workshop activity of writing a member job description. This provides an opportunity for the board to discuss together its role as a board and the role of an individual board member.
 - <u>8 rules for avoiding board meeting conflict</u> -- The article provides eight rules for avoiding board meeting conflict beginning with "being informed."
