- **4.** Board & Administrator for Board Members Monthly Publication May 2017 Reflection I have provided a brief reflection on a few of the articles from the May publication. I hope you have had an opportunity to read and reflect.

- Agenda construction: Eliminate what's unimportant The article offers reminders and a
 process in order to keep a Board focused on what is most important at a board meeting
 beginning with the work of the board chair and superintendent in developing the meeting
 agenda. Suggestions include
 - ✓ Begin agenda development well in advance
 - ✓ Gather Board input
 - ✓ Superintendent modify agenda as needed and submit for final review
 - ✓ Post agenda for board members well in advance of meeting
 - ✓ Anticipate issues
- <u>Protocols, process necessary for effective meetings</u> The article suggests having a
 board meeting agenda that keeps the board focused on "high-priority" items to the
 district in order for an effective board meeting to occur. Protocols for an effective
 board meeting are offered including:
 - ✓ Place requests to include an item on the agenda in the manner outlined in policy
 - Development and approval of board meeting agenda by chair and superintendent should be done at least one week in advance and agenda should be available to board members with enough time to prepare
 - ✓ Utilize a consent agenda
 - ✓ Important for board members to follow policy in requesting items to be placed on agenda as well as members requesting to remove an item from the consent agenda.
 - ✓ No surprises!
- Board sets direction, superintendent whacks away the weeds -- The article offers
 reminders to ensure roles and responsibilities are clearly defined of board
 members and the superintendent.
- 5. State Budget Legislative Overview Highlights of the education bill include:
 - Totals for the biennium include \$483 million
 - Adds 2% and 2% to the education formula equaling \$274 million in the biennium which amounts to an increase of \$121 per student in FY '18 and \$124 in FY '19
 - Continues increases in LTFM funding of \$131.3 million
 - Creates Ag2School 40% Ag credit for school facility debt taxes amounting to \$35.5 million in FY'19
 - Establishes new Professional Educator Licensure Board
 - Establishes a new tiered teacher licensure system
 - No changes to TRA in these bills
 - Establishes a new School Readiness Plus (SR+) program with \$50 million in biennium for 4 year olds
 - Expands support for concurrent enrollment teacher credentialing with \$375,000 annually for 4 years
 - Restricts special elections to five dates in February, April, May, August, and November
- **6. ISG Update** I have not had an update since the May Board meeting. I believe we are still on schedule to have a report by August or September.
- 7. Paraprofessional Association Negotiations No meetings are scheduled until late August.

- **8. Teacher Association Negotiations** No meetings are scheduled at this time. Language work is being done by a subcommittee.
- **9. Board Work Session** I have sent a doodle calendar poll to Board members regarding the scheduling of a board work session in the coming month. Dates including June 27 & 28, and July 10, 11, and 12. Possible work objectives include:
 - Superintendent work goals for 2018-2019
 - Board self evaluation including work goals for 2018-2019
 - Strategic Plan review
